
**Source Drain Diode Forward Voltage**




**On-Resistance vs. Gate-to-Source Voltage**









**Normalized Thermal Transient Impedance, Junction-to-Ambient**



**Normalized Thermal Transient Impedance, Junction-to-Ambient**






